Route Information:

The route starts in Nagoya and follows the Chubu Expressway (256) westward. It then turns inland, following National Route 109 and National Route 418, through various villages like Achi, Hirayama, Genu, Kameki, and Ichinomiya. It ends in Iida, where it connects to the Chūō Expressway (25). The total distance is approximately 180 km.
